



Port Hedland is a coastal town in the Pilbara region of Western Australia, situated 1,600 kilometres by road from Perth. Construction of the first Port Hedland jetty began in 1896 to service the needs of the pastoral industry.

The Port of Port Hedland is the world's largest bulk export port by tonnage, located on the traditional lands of the Kariyarra peoples. The port has a single entry channel which extends for approximately 40 kilometres and is impacted by a 7.4 metre tidal swing.


