



LUMSDEN POINT DEVELOPMENT



Pilbara Ports is progressing the development of a new multi-user facility and logistics hub at Lumsden Point in the Port of Port Hedland.

The Lumsden Point development will aid the export of critical minerals, the import of renewable energy infrastructure, as well as support the rapid growth of direct shipping services to the Pilbara.

Multi-user facility and logistics hub

Primarily funded by the Commonwealth and State Governments, the development includes:

- Dredging of channel access and turning basins to ensure the safe and efficient berthing of vessels at the new facility.
- Construction of two new multi-user berths, known as PH5 and PH6, with two mobile harbour cranes operating on the berths
- The development of over 100 hectares of reclaimed land for logistics and operational use. This will include laydown areas, biosecurity infrastructure, and lease lots, enabling private sector investment in the development.

- A central access road and service corridor connecting to the Great Northern Highway.
- Roads and intersection upgrades on Great Northern Highway, including a roundabout, bridges and access ramps to improve road safety, and facilitate increased traffic volumes and movement of over-size and over-mass cargo.

The Lumsden Point development is a key part of the plan to increase capacity at the Port of Port Hedland and is recognised as a priority project by Infrastructure Australia.

Driving new opportunities

This exciting port expansion will help to position Port Hedland at the forefront of future green industries, helping drive WA's transition to renewables, unlocking trade and investment opportunities and creating hundreds of new jobs.

The first of the two new Lumsden Point berths is scheduled for completion in mid-2026, with the operations expected to start shortly after.

The second berth is planned to be completed in late-2026.
